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


Assalamu Alaikum,



- all published newsletters


We encourage all parents to download the free Skool Loop app onto your phones ASAP. Already WGS events are being listed on the app for easy access by parents.

LAST DAY OF TERM 2



Term 2 is progressing well with the fasting month of Ramadan the main focus. Students have been encouraged to utilise this valuable month to gain piety, discipline and self-restraint. The school organised a number of events for students to help support the needy — these included the charity drive and food hampers. Special Ramadan events included the Ramadan Goals chart, three separate student iftars, the Quran competition and Abaya Day.

An ongoing focus at school is bullying which unfortunately can affect students adversely. It is important to know what is considered bullying and what is not. Bullying occurs when three aspects combine: there is a misuse of power (e.g., by a physically stronger student), which is ongoing and repeated, and involves behaviours that can cause harm. Common types of bullying include: verbal (name calling, insulting, teasing, for example based on race or disability); physical (hitting, shoving, intimidating, etc.); and social (excluding, gossiping, isolating, etc.).

The following is not considered bullying: disagreements or arguments, not liking someone, a single act of social rejection, one-off acts of meanness or spite, isolated incidents of aggression, intimidation or violence. We call on parents to reiterate the message with their children that bullying is harmful and not permitted. Any student who is being bullied at school should tell a teacher as soon as possible. WGS is committed to providing a safe and supportive teaching and learning environment, where diversity is valued and all members of the school community are respected.

We are successfully into the middle of the second term of 2019. This year the School was able to organise the NAPLAN completely online, with minor hiccups. During the year we plan to focus on the IT skills of the students so they become more enabled and confident in sitting for online tests.

To improve the standard of teaching and upskilling of our teachers, professional development courses were arranged in the beginning of the term. Some teachers were also sent to the Association of Independent Schools (AIS) to complete professional development courses in their relevant faculties.

A new initiative adopted this term to enhance the active involvement of parents in their child's education saw Years 12, 11, 10 and 9 students and their parents invited for compulsory interviews with me to discuss their term 1 performance, study plans and future academic goals. This initiative was successful with near 100% attendance. The same approach was taken for students in classes Kindergarten to Year 8, but only with a select number of students and parents. We are also working to further develop the academic culture at the school by introducing weekly informal assessments in class. These informal assessments complement formal assessment tasks and allow students to improve on their academic performance.

This term and next will see increased support being given to our Year 12 students with extra classes after school and online support at home. We hope to improve our Year 12 and HSC results this year and are confident that our Year 12 students will perform to their best abilities. In Weeks 7 and 8, half-yearly exams will be held. Teachers are working hard with students in providing them with study guides and revision material. We anticipate that by supporting and guiding students now this will result in a marked improvement in students' performance overall.

We wish to thank all parents and guardians for their ongoing support that they provide at home. We pray that the month of Ramadan was a spiritually fulfilling one for you all. Eid Mubarak in advance to all of you.
