#### Inside the Kindergarten Classroom

Kindergarten students have been very busy in the first three weeks, participating in a number of exciting learning experiences. Our main focus during these first few weeks is on recycling. Students watched a documentary on the subject and also visited Plumpton Park to explore the impact of rubbish on our environment. The young brains were arresped to learn some facts about the wastage of the resources that they encounter every day. For instance:



- A dripping tap wastes more than 2,000 liters of water a month. That equals to more than 13 thousand. classes of water.
- Composting food scraps can reduce their dimete impact while also recycling their nutrients. (All you have to do is dig a small hole in your garden bed, put waste fruit and vegetable peels and then cover it with soil. You will have a rich soil in which you can grow your own organic vegetables).
- By switching off appliances at the time when you're not using them, you'll be surprised how much energy. you save. Over the period of time it can make a big difference to your power bill, and our environment.
