

## Principals Message



Assalaamu-alaykum warahmatullaahi wabarakaatuh Term 4 is nearing its end with only a few weeks left. Student wellbeing and welfare support is crucial during this term. Prior to the exams students in years 5-12 were given study tips and relaxation techniques to help with exam stress. Some stress is needed to perform well, but too much stress may be harmful and students therefore need to learn how to manage stress well. Parents can and should assist with this important life skill by modelling to their child/ren the cor

rect way of coping with stress. In week 3 high school girls organised a bake sale to help raise fund to support some students students who could not afford the school camp. Witnessing this spirit of helping others in need is heart-warming and makes working in this environment extremely rewarding. Also in week 3, a select group of students performed a special play to the high school assembly about mental health. The purpose of the play was to remove the stigma associated with mental illness focussing on depression and conveying the message "say yes to mental wellbeing." The school's chess club entered two teams into an inter-school zone tournament with one team finishing 3 rd and then going on to compete in the finals. Many students enjoy playing chess and regularly participate during recess and lunch. The strategic skills they develop playing chess will benefit them in their curriculum subjects. Another interesting club that was started this term is the knitting club under the guidance of our school counsellor, Ms Kaukab. Knitting is being used as a relaxation technique for select students needing counsellor support. It was then requested to extend the activity to other students as well and thus the knitting club was formed. We take this opportunity to wish students well over the long holiday break. Parents are encouraged to engage their child/ren productively over the break with salah, reading Quran, general reading, maths online, creative pursuits, physical exercise, etc. Students should be careful not
