SENIOR MANAGEMENT MESSAGE

Term 3 has been a busy term despite the COVID -19 restrictions. Western Grammar School did not waste any time in making improvements to its education and academic systems. As the term began, students from K to 10 started doing the Progressive Assessment Tests (PAT). These external tests are designed to check the abilities of our students in Grammar and Punctuation, Mathematics, Reading and Spelling. Based on the results, WGS will be introducing in Primary School a new literacy program, Get Reading Right, which is an explicit systematic synthetic program which will help every child in reading and spelling.

The HSC Minimum Standard is also part of an effort to improve the literacy and numeracy outcomes for students. This standard is a way of supporting and ensuring students have a functional level of literacy and numeracy. In Term 3 most of our students in Year 10 to 12 demonstrated a minimum standard of literacy and numeracy to receive their HSC.

Our Year 12 students were busy with informal and formal trials and completed their last exam on the 11th of September. WGS will continue supporting its Year 12 group. We pray that their hard work pays off, and their aspirations for the future are realised. Our Year 11 students also completed their Preliminary Final exams on 23rd September 2020.

This year we had an increased number of students completing the Premier's Reading Challenge which closed on the 28th of August 2020. Throughout the school, we also introduced a timetable to maximise the use of the library computers to further develop the typing and computing skills of our students.

Alhamdulillah students and staff of WGS raised \$8,000 for the Lebanon Crisis Appeal organised by a group of Year 7 students. These students were affected by the devastating bombing incident and wanted to do something to help.

They motivated students and staff to donate and also ran a dessert stall. Significantly, two classes collected more than \$1,000 each—Year 6 and Year 10. Well done to all students who demonstrated their generosity and concern for those less fortunate.

The money collected was handed over to a local charity, AusRelief and two representatives were in attendance on 27 August to accept the donation. The charity will ensure that the money is used to provide much needed emergency health care in Beirut.
