Mathletics

Mathletics is a new initiative that Western Grammar School has taken on board this term. It is a very exciting and engaging maths resource that students have access to from home. Students will be able to further enhance and excel their skills at maths using Mathletics. They will learn new concepts in a fun way. Mathletics gives each student their very own personal learning space. Filled with targeted curriculum content, interactive tutorials and support, alongside engaging games and rewards, Mathletics is the world's most used education and maths website. It is the next generation in learning, helping students enjoy maths and improve their results. Mathletics covers the full Kindergarten to Year 12 curriculum.

Over 1200 curriculum activities targeting the Australian curriculum outcomes, each one automatically evolving as students' progress in understanding. Pre and post assessment plus interactive and video support is also available. With additional problem solving games, a virtual avatar store, bonus credits and weekly award certificates, Mathletics keeps students engaged and on task right across the school year.

Students earn points for each correct answer within Live Mathletics and curriculum activities.

A weekly target of 1000 points earns a student a certificate, building though bronze, silver and gold across the school year. Credits are awarded for improvement over personal bests to spend on virtual avatars. Top scoring students are showcased on the Mathletics homepage live Hall of Fame!

School Leading Learning program for 2015

The program's core objectives are to review, refine and develop a school improvement plan targeting quality teaching and quality learning. We are working closely with the Association of Independent Schools NSW, allowing us to tap into a wealth of professional learning resources, seek guidance from experienced educators and develop professional networks. Our aim is to channel all available resources to align specific teaching practices with the profile of students at Western Grammar, with the aid of ongoing teacher professional development.

Phase 1 - Data collection

This forms perhaps the most crucial phase of the program. To date, our teachers have spent more than 70 hours collectively gathering student data and preparing the grounds for analysis.

Phase 2 – Data Analysis and consolidation

After evaluating the results of phase 1 we identified student weakness and thereby created class profiles.

Phase 3 – Developing a school self-assessment policy

This was followed by a consolidation of all class profiles to form a school wide focus area. This is a summation of all individual and class profiles which involved selecting ONE priority area as the target of improvement for 2015/16. This area has been identified as student writing. We will be focusing on improving student writing, specifically on the following elements: ideas, cohesion, paragraphing, text structure, sentence structure, punctuation and spelling.

Phase 4 – Developing a school improvement plan

This will involve providing professional learning in the identified focus groups and priority areas through ongoing professional development and training sessions. This will enable our teachers to providing lessons that can facilitate student writing in the above mentioned areas.

Academic excellence forms a major part of a successful school, community and nation. This school leading and learning program will better equip the staff at Western Grammar School towards achieving excellence.










YEAR 2

Assalaam Alaikum Wa Rahmatullaahi Wa Barakaatuh parents and students,

As we reach the end of our third term, it excites us to inform you that over the past two weeks, we have been focusing on the virtues of the first 10 days of Dhul-Hijjah, Hajj and Sacrifice (Qurbani). Students across the school have been discussing the process of Hajj and have been given practical demonstrations of some of the rituals performed during Hajj. This will give the students a good understanding about what the pilgrims have to do to undertake this spiritual journey.

There has been much interest amongst the students as many of them are aware that Mr Malik went last year and this year we have Mr Shakir from Year 5/6 performing his Hajj. We wish him all the best throughout his journey and we ask Allah to accept hajj as the reward of an accepted Hajj is Paradise.

Hajj is the fifth pillar of Islam. The Prophet said, "Hasten to perform Hajj, for verily one of you does not know what might happen.". (Musnad Imam Ahmed)

Upon whom is Hajj compulsory? A Muslim, mature, sane, free, and the one who has the ability (physically, financially, has safe passage and a mahram for females)

What are some of the places on visits during the Hajj? Makkah, Mina (which includes the jamarat), Arafah and Muzdulifah

What is the cloth that the Pilgrims wear? An Ihram – This is two pieces of cloth or towel that the males wear. The females wear normal clothing. The boys have been practicing this in their classrooms.

What should be recited when in the state of Ihram? The Talbiyah: *Labaik Allahuma Labaik, Labaika Laa sharikalaka labaik, Innal hamda wa ni'mata laka walmuk, La sharikalak.* Students have been practicing this in the class to get into the spirit of things.

What is Qurbani (also known as Udhiyyah)? This is the sacrifice of a livestock animal during Eid-Al-Adha. The practice of Qurbani can be traced back to Prophet Ibrahim. Ibrahim dreamt that Allah ordered him to sacrifice his son. This story had been elaborated in the classroom throughout the two weeks.

During this exciting time, we would also like to welcome our new staff member to the Islamic Studies Department, Sheikh Ikramullah Ahmad, who is teaching Quran and Arabic studies. We are very pleased to have him as a new addition in our school and we believe he will have a great impact on the students at WGS.

The students of WGS have proven themselves as great seekers of knowledge following the path of our beloved Prophet Muhammad. We are all looking forward to see the fruits of their hard work through achieving pleasing results in their term and yearly exams. We encourage the students to use their holiday break wisely and do their studies on a regular basis.

SRC ACTIVITIES








Assalamu Alaikum,

Announcements

- <u>Use of mobile phones & other electronic items:</u> It has been observed that students are bringing mobile phones to school. This is against school policy and parents need to write a letter to the school stating why it is necessary for their children to have mobile phones during school hours. Lunch Box Idea

Ingredients:

- 5 cups Rice Bubbles
- 2 cups vanilla marshmallows (200g)
- 100g butter, chopped
- 50g white chocolate, melted
- 2 tbsp rainbow chocolate chips

Method:

- Grease a 16cm x 26cm (base) slice pan. Line with baking paper, extending paper 2cm above edges on all sides.
- Place Rice Bubbles in a large bowl. Place marshmallows and butter in a large microwave-safe bowl. Microwave on HIGH (100%) for 1 minute, stirring every 30 seconds or until mixture is smooth. Add to Rice Bubbles. Stir to coat well.
- Press mixture firmly and evenly into prepared pan. Drizzle with white chocolate. Sprinkle with rainbow choc chips.
 Refrigerate for 2 hours or until set.
- Cut into 20 bars. Wrap each bar in plastic wrap. Refrigerate until required.
