Year 1 has finished learning about History for this term and has started studying Geography. Year 11 Biology EXPLORING THE EVOLUTION OF THE AUSTRALIAN BIOTA

Throughout the term, Year 11 has been exploring the final topic of Preliminary Biology; Evolution of the Australian Biota. The module is based on the study of past environments to understand how the implications of our present-day actions can affect our environment, particularly the distribution of flora and fauna. Furthermore, the topic increases students' understanding of the applications and uses of biology, the implications for society and the environment and current issues, research and developments in biology.

In order to investigate the topics in detail, Year 11 students undertook a series of hands on activities as a form of formative assessment to confirm their ability to apply their understanding

of the topic. Some of the activities students performed included:

- Extraction of DNA from strawberries and Kiwi
- Reconstructing plants and labelling their parts
- Taking apart a flower and labelling its components
- In class quizzes and class discussions
- In class research projects and more

Year 11 students have completed an assignment evaluating the classification and adaptations of various Australian fauna and flora. Overall, biology students performed well in the final assessment before the Year 11 yearly exams. Best of luck to them all!

Organisation

It's wise to backward map from your main objectives down. This will ensure you don't lose sight of your end goals.

Past Papers


Do not think that past papers are useful only before exams. You should attempt past papers as you move through your content and skip those questions that you haven't covered. Attempting past paper questions are one of the most effective ways to prepare for exams.

Daily revision

Success is all about establishing positive work habits. Revision enables students to recall and retain information. Only through consistent revision can students recall relevant and large amounts of information for exams. Students should be revising at least 1 hour per subject per week in addition to all assigned homework.

Self-motivation

Every student should be asking themselves why they are doing the HSC. What motivates them to do their best? What are their future goals and aspirations? Success in the HSC is all about establishing positive work habits and routines driven by self-motivation.



This term, Western Grammar School Year 9 students were introduced to a new program titled Poetry from Different Cultures. The unit exposed and engaged students with diversity and exposure to different cultures around the world and the aesthetics of language through poetry.

Students were taught to understand and familiarize themselves with the power of language to explore and express views that are either theirs or others, and to engage with the aesthetic dimensions of cultural experiences. Students were introduced to poems that provided insight into the cultural, social and political perspectives sourced from other countries and other times.

Western Grammar Year 7 students have been introduced to the elements of drama and its variations as they engage in a range of texts from the Elizabethan era. Students explored the social, cultural and historical context of 17th century England for the purpose of representing the society in the form of a collage. They


have also been introduced to the language of and features of scripts. Students have also been exposed to, and been involved in, the art of role play.


Our Year 8 students have been studying the traditional forms of news media and the language and structures used in the past. Students have also examined contemporary methods of news reporting, including print media, online newspapers and social media reporting.



The morning of Thursday, the 3rd of August, brought a wave of fresh faced and chattering Year 10 students to Mt Druitt station. Rubbing away the visible remnants of sleep, the English students rushed to board the arriving train and hasten their arrival to the Sydney Opera House.

During the course of Term 2, our Year 10 class studied playwright William Shakespeare's tragedy, "Macbeth". The indepth study we conducted involved extensively exploring the appropriation of the play into a graphic novel and analysing visual techniques and structure. After writing various essays on the play's enduring themes and use of language, our appreciation for the play and its thematic elements was heightened during the excursion. We experienced for ourselves the tragic rise and fall of its eponymous hero through a thrilling 90-minute production at the Sydney Opera House. The clever integration of modern references to the 400-year-old play was surprising and maintained relevance to the world today — with Macbeth occasionally facetiming his destructive deeds. We remained immersed and entertained throughout and afterwards enjoyed lunch at a contemporary food court with an array of diverse outlets. Before we went home, we prayed the Dhuhr salah and made our journey back to the train station. The ride home was full of lots of laughter, corny jokes and most importantly, content grins.





Where did we go? Brewongle! Why did we go? For Geography! What did we do? Have fun!! This term Kindergarten, Year 1, Year 1/2 and Year 2 went to Brewongle Education Centre for their geography excursion. We had a blast! From the long bus ride to the amazing experience in nature, K-2 absolutely loved it! Shortly after arriving at Brewongle we were introduced to our guides who explained to us how to greet and respect the land we live on. We were told that we were currently on 'Darug country' and we should pay respect to the original owners of the land. After that Kindergarten adventured off into the wilderness where we saw Wendy the wallaby and were acquainted with a blue tongue lizard, Stumpy, for whom we created shelters. Then we created maps using twigs, leaves and rocks that told a story. While Kindergarten was doing this, the rest of the troops made memory sticks using things they found in the wilderness to remember Aboriginal seasons. They then went on a bug and insect hunt- it was pretty cool! If that wasn't enough they managed to explore different habitats of various animals and used cameras to investigate their homes and see what was inside. To end a great day we were lucky enough to catch a glimpse of our beautiful Hawkesbury River and were mesmerised by its magnificence.

All up we had a pretty remarkable day- we had the best time ever and learnt so much!
