Imagine you having to travel through a maze blind folded with only a voice of a friend to guide you, who would that friend be? Researchers have commented that when one of our senses are not active the other senses heighten to fill the absence. Furthermore, when a sense like sight is hindered individuals feel a sense of uncertainty and discomfort.

In order to test the aforementioned ideas, Year 10 designed three mazes that lead to a common destination. Students were teamed in groups of two and were asked to complete the maze with one person instructing and the other person completing the maze blind folded. There were three main rules that were applied to the activity;

- 1. Only one person can be on the path at a time and only one person could guide the blind folded individual
- 2. The person completing the maze is not allowed to step outside the maze, if they do they must return to the beginning of the maze regardless of how close they are to finish line
- 3. The person can't to go backwards.

Students really enjoyed designing the activity and practicing it with one another. The activity was a means of reminding students about the importance of their senses and the value of trust. ### **Ask Your Teen's Opinion**

Encourage discussion as much as possible in your house. Ask your child for their opinion about political and social issues, or about books, movies, and TV shows. Listen carefully and prompt them to express their ideas thoughtfully, backing up their claims with evidence. Having dinner together as a family may be harder to do as your child gets older and there are more demands on their time, but this is one of the best ways to stimulate these kinds of conversations.

### **Discuss the News**

Encourage your child to become a more discerning consumer of news and information. Have an ongoing discussion with them about how you get your news and how you decide which sources to trust. Point out examples of misleading information you see, such as in ads, so that your child learns to be sceptical of some sources. Bookmark some Internet sites that you consider to be reliable and that they can use as reference for information sources.

### Help Develop a Homework Routine

Help your child develop a consistent homework routine. Make sure that they review what was covered in school that day and help them learn how to keep track of long-term assignments as well as revise previous topics weekly. They should have a system for managing their workload, but continue to help them. Revising previous content is of the utmost importance too, as you don't want your child to re-learn concepts by themself the night before the exam.



The bus trip home was long but time was passed by endless riddles, jokes and games. Many students were sad to leave and tired enough to sleep
















# Tibrary Mews


