


Principal's Message

Year One



Assalamu Alaikum,

1H has had an eventful year and is continuing to do so this term. The students have improved in reading and writing since the beginning of the year and have also developed their mathematical and scientific thinking skills.

This term, we focused on presenting structural arguments in the form of writing expositions. Year 1 demonstrated great understanding and enthusiasm as they delved into debating several topics. We also solidified our spelling and grammar skills on a weekly basis. Students have worked hard to increase their reading levels and many have shown great results. In Maths, we have explored the ideas of volume and capacity and have engaged in hands-on activities such as measuring water. We also made clocks with moveable hands using paper plates as we learnt about reading a clock. Year 1 learnt some new strategies to consolidate our addition and subtraction skills. In Science, students are learning about push and pull toys. They have designed and created their own toys out of materials that they collected from home, such as plastic bottles. Some designs and executions have been very impressive and have shown deep scientific thought process.

As we finish the year, I would recommend each of my students to keep up the enthusiasm for learning that they have developed and shown. Reading at least fifteen minutes each day at home is incumbent in improving their skills of vocabulary, concentration and comprehension. Students will also benefit from regular revision of mathematical concepts at home.

Thank you for your ongoing support throughout the year.



Preparing for Year 11

As exciting and meaningful as it may appear, Year 11 can be equally daunting and stressful for not only students but their families. For this reason it is crucial to educate ourselves and become familiar with coping strategies and general advice to avoid a shadow of stress and anxiety that can often loom over this rewarding journey.

We need to ensure we appreciate our children as they will often be feeling very stressed, even if it's not obvious to us. Many kids fear letting their family down so beware of setting unrealistic expectations. Some worry they can't do as well as a sibling, or friend. Many kids are feeling overwhelmed about what lies ahead in their post school life. We need to understand people under pressure become supersensitive and explosive from time to time. Family members are usually the first targets. Try not to overreact. Despite this, we need to set realistic targets and goals. Not all HSC students will go on to university – but they can still have a wealth of excellent and satisfying career options. If they don't get the HSC marks they needed and still really want to go on to tertiary education later, there are many other pathways. Interestingly, the success rate of mature age students is much higher than for those who go straight from school. It is also important to encourage a healthy balance between work and leisure. Sometimes as parents we can oversee there need for this, therefore encourage them to join a sports club or participate in regular social gatherings of their interest.




Boys Camp
